

My own, and only signature, below, should be equivalent as two honest and trustworthy witnesses.

I, signed below, leased to the non-Jew, Karl Kitzka, the Inn, which I myself leased from Sir Neiyemsky, for two years, according a contract I have.

The Inn is located on the Brizna (?) Village.

Leasing the Inn, included also the yards, and all of the furniture and instruments.

I leased the Inn to the non-Jew, mentioned above, for one-quarter of days of each month, for the sum of 150 rubel. However, I will have to pay for wood, oil, and all other expenses.

I definitely clarified to the non-Jew that the fourth of days of each month belonging to him, should not be taken on one time. Instead, on each week he should have the Inn for two days: on Friday and Saturday.

He gave me a deposit of =20=k (R), and for the balance I granted him a loan until the time when the Inn will belong completely to me, on the First of Lipyez (R), 5653 (1893).

He also agreed that all the conditions I signed with Sir Neiyemsky, positive or negative, should be valid as a legal contract.

I gave him the keys to all the rooms, to keep as long the contract will be valid.

We also agreed, that I have the legal right to inspect the Inn periodically.

I wrote and signed the contract with my own free will, under no force or persuasion, on the Fourth Day of the Week, Seven Thishre, 5650 (September, 1890), here, Brizna.
