Betsy will receive a master's degree in piano from Juilliard this spring. She plans to present a concert on March 16 in Berkeley, piano works for 4 hands (only two of them her own). Her rich tone, wild dynamic control and free vibrato were far from the Franco-Belgian style once favored in this piece, but Athayde's impish wit was Gallic enough and her sometimes reckless phrasing was thrilling."
