Alumni Concertmasters

We last wrote about **Juliana Athayde** (OYO 1991-02 at age 11) in the Fall of 2005 when she had recently assumed the Concertmaster chair of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra. Things continue to go well and Juliana performed as violin soloist on the Bruch this week!

Maria Larionoff was a member of OYO 1974-78, and concertmaster in 1977-78. The November-December 2007 issue of Symphony Magazine reported that the Seattle Symphony just named her one of four violinists filling that post. Congrats!

A graduate of Juilliard, and a former member of the Los Angeles Philharmonic's first violin section, she has performed regularly both in recital and with the orchestras of San Francisco, Los Angeles, New York and Seattle. Maria has been featured as soloist with the Seattle Symphony many times, both in concert and recording, most recently in critically acclaimed performances of Lalo's "Symphonie Espagnole." Her versatility as a violist as well as a violinist has led to appearances with the International Music Festival of Seattle, the Seattle Chamber Music Festival, and the Mostly Mozart Festival in New York and Japan. She is on the faculty of the University of Washington, and has served as faculty at the Marrowstone Music Festival, and as the principal violin and viola coach of the Seattle Youth Symphony.

Many Scholarships awarded


